PLEASE DON'T LITTER. Litter can harm humans and animals alike. Pick up all trash (e.g., broken bottles, tab tops, plastic bags, and cigarette butts) and dispose of it in designated trash and recycle containers.



PLEASE DON'T DISTURB OR FEED WILDLIFE. Birds and other animals feed, rest, and nest in the park. Enjoy watching them, but remember not to chase or disturb them in any way. Don't be tempted to feed birds, raccoons, squirrels or other wildlife because it can cause them to become aggressive and affect their ability to survive in the wild.



PLEASE – NO LIVE SHELL COLLECTING. Taking live shells has significantly reduced the number of shells now here. Enjoy collecting shells from the beach, but do not take shells that still have live creatures inside (e.g., sand dollars, starfish, whelks, and hermit crabs).
