

## Park Recovery and Renewal

Concessions are scheduled to return to the park around Dec. 1<sup>st</sup> in Parking Area 2. Services will include rental of beach tents, chairs, and watercraft and purchase of pre-packaged food. Considering recent weather events, this opening may be delayed. We will update Friends as information becomes available.

#### Turtle Nest Adoptions.

This season, we had 60 nest adoptions with an additional 16 nests coming in late in the season. Mother nature delt us a blow in August when Tropical Storm Debbie visited the park with 1-3



us a blow in August when Tropical Storm Debbie visited the park with 1-3 ft storm surge, flooding the beach and roads with water. We lost several cages, but hopefully, unmarked nests survived to produce hatchlings.

Shortly after the park reopens (date not yet announced), we hope to celebrate our Turtle Nest Adoption donors at a beach event. We invite you to join us for refreshments on the beach and to pick up your adoption packet. Adoption information for next season's turtle nests will

also be made available at the event.

## Tropical Storm Debbie, Hurricane Helene

On August 3-4, our shores received an unwelcome visitor—Tropical Storm Debbie brought wind, rain and storm surge. In preparation for the visit, park staff and some "Friends" emptied various storage sheds and transported materials off site for safe keeping. Sheds were then reassembled, and materials restored to the park on Tues. August 6<sup>th</sup>. Unfortunately, the rain and surge further compromised some roads in the park enlarging potholes and undermining the pavement. This will necessitate future rebuilding and repaving some areas in the park, particularly in the boat ramp area.

Sept 25<sup>th</sup>- 26<sup>th</sup>, BAD NEWS: Hurricane Helene moved 3-4 ft of sand from the beach to the roads and parking lots and signage was negatively impacted. GOOD NEWS: the shop area was undamaged, gopher tortoises seemed to have weathered the storm, and mangroves received limited debris deposit. Clean-up is currently proceeding.

#### Fl State Park Foundation Grant: The MoSH

The Mobile Shade House (we call it the **MoSH**) trailer was delivered to the park on August 20<sup>th</sup>. This unit was purchased with a generous grant from the FLSP Foundation and will be fitted with shelves, trays, irrigation and shade cloth to provide a space for propagating plants to re-vegetate portions of the park. Those of you that are either construction-skilled and/or plant lovers are encouraged to volunteer your talents as we move forward with the project.
