


Rangers Terry Nowak and Alyssa Rothstein show off the ADA accessible water fountain and new platform they installed at bath house 4. Great Job!!

PRESIDEN T'S CORNER

What's On Your Bucket List? By Marcia Byrd

Have you seen the Ken Burns' documentary: The National Parks: America's Best Idea? After viewing the six episodes, my husband and I decided that we would add to our bucket list – "Visit all the National Parks." Over the years we have visited and camped in

many national parks but we had plenty more to explore. So we loaded our hiking gear into the Sequoia and headed west for exciting adventures in fourteen national parks– one in Nevada, Oregon, and Arizona, two in Colorado and nine in California. My Fodor's Complete Guide to the National Parks of the West was all we needed to make the best use of every exhilarating day along the journey. I will admit to using my iPhone to google restaurants and sights along the way, too.

The grandeur and diversity of these parks is humbling to say the least. We experienced temperatures from 122 degrees to below freezing. We drove to summits over 10,000 feet and spent a stifling half-hour at Badwater in Death Valley, 292 feet below sea level. In Sequoia, Kings Canyon, and Redwood National Parks we saw the largest and tallest trees in the world, the sequoia and the coast redwood, grown from pinecones no larger than a chicken egg or an olive, respectively! In Joshua Tree National Park we learned that those trees are not really trees but plants from the yucca family. Trees that were once living trees but are now rocks are lying in the Petrified Forest National Park. At Great Basin National Park we hiked up over 10,000 feet to find bristlecone pines, amazing survivors of the high desert that are over 4,000 years old! (OK, I loved the trees. Actually I was awed by them.) We hiked across snow fields and in streams, up rock domes, around lakes, and in caves. It was a trip of contrasts for sure.

Every park offered larger-than-life panoramas, jaw dropping sights formed by volcanoes, shifting plates, earthquakes, wind and water. Uniquely different was Mesa Verde National Park in southwestern Colorado, set aside to preserve the culture of the Ancestral Pueblo peoples who farmed on the mesas and lived in pit houses and in the cliff dwellings built over centuries. We had the benefit of paved walkways and steps to get to the cliff dwellings and were amazed by the skill it took to reach these dwellings, located in arches of rock hundreds of feet above canyons and hundreds of feet below the mesas.

Each park's visitor center offered exceptional information through films and displays on the history and geology of the park. Helpful, friendly, and enthusiastic rangers and volunteers were available to talk with us about hikes and what not to miss. Within each park we found plaques and memorials to so many exceptional individuals - John Muir, Theodore Roosevelt, Woodrow Wilson, Stephen Mather, and others - who fought to preserve these lands for future generations. America's best idea, for sure. Returning to Paradise here in Naples, and to Delnor-Wiggins Pass State Park, to jaw dropping sights formed by sun, wind, and water, I am reminded of the natural diversity Continued...



which exists in our small 160 acre park. In a few paces and up to elevations of only a foot, we can experience trees that only grow in brackish waters, trees that need that foot or so of elevation to live in the coastal hammocks, trees that grow on the beaches and in the dunes. We have gopher tortoises that do not like the Gulf waters and Loggerhead turtles that swim to our beach to nest. And I am also reminded that like the national parks, our beautiful park exists due to the foresight, advocacy and support of individuals who fought to preserve this land for future generations. We too display a plaque in Dellora's Garden (area #5), in grateful appreciation to Lester and Dellora Norris who made the purchase of this park possible. Collier County's best idea, for sure.
